Zucchini and sweet potato slice

This good-for-you savoury slice is great for lunch or with roast tomatoes for dinner

Ingredients

- 2 tsp olive oil
- 1 large brown onion, finely chopped
- 300g sweet potato, peeled, coarsely grated
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 4 eggs
- 2 egg whites
- 40g (1/4 cup) plain flour
- 125g (1/2 cup) reduced-fat fresh ricotta
- 250g zucchini, grated, moisture removed
- 2 tbs chopped fresh chives
- 2 tbs chopped fresh continental parsley
- 240g cherry truss tomatoes (see note)
- Baby rocket leaves, to serve
- Balsamic vinegar, to serve

Method

- Step 1 Preheat oven to 180C. Grease and line a 26 x 16cm (base measurement) slice pan.
- Step 2 Heat the oil in a large non-stick frying pan over high heat. Cook the onion, stirring, for 3 minutes or until soft. Stir in the sweet potato for 3-4 minutes or until soft. Stir in the garlic for 1 minutes or until aromatic.
- Step 3 Whisk the eggs, egg whites and flour in a large bowl until smooth. Whisk in ricotta until just combined. Stir in the sweet potato mixture, zucchini, chives and parsley.
- Step 4 Pour the mixture into the prepared pan. Bake for 25-30 minutes or until golden and cooked through. Set aside to cool slightly.
- Step 5 Meanwhile, place the tomatoes on a baking tray. Spray with olive oil. Roast for 10 minutes or until just soft.
- Step 6 Serve the slice with tomatoes, rocket and a drizzle of vinegar.

Camp Kalbarri

Book your place by 12 April!

The Shire Bus is heading for Kalbarri for a 4 night camp at the PCYC, leaving on Friday 26 April and returning on Tuesday 30.



This camp is mainly for the kids but note that any child under 8 years old must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.

If it is a family of say 7, one adult and 6 kids, it will be \$45. This is a non-refundable booking fee and must be paid by Friday 12 April to secure your transport. As there may be limited seating for transport, those families that register and pay the fee first are more likely to secure their booking. Yalgoo Emu Cup

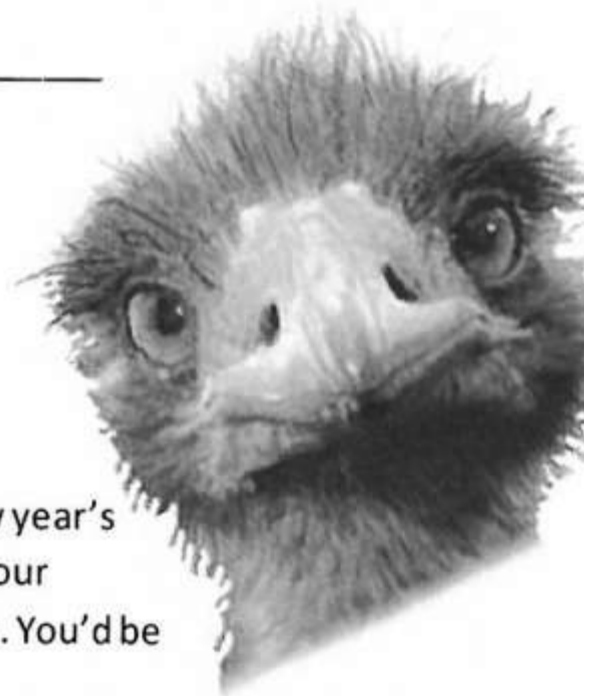

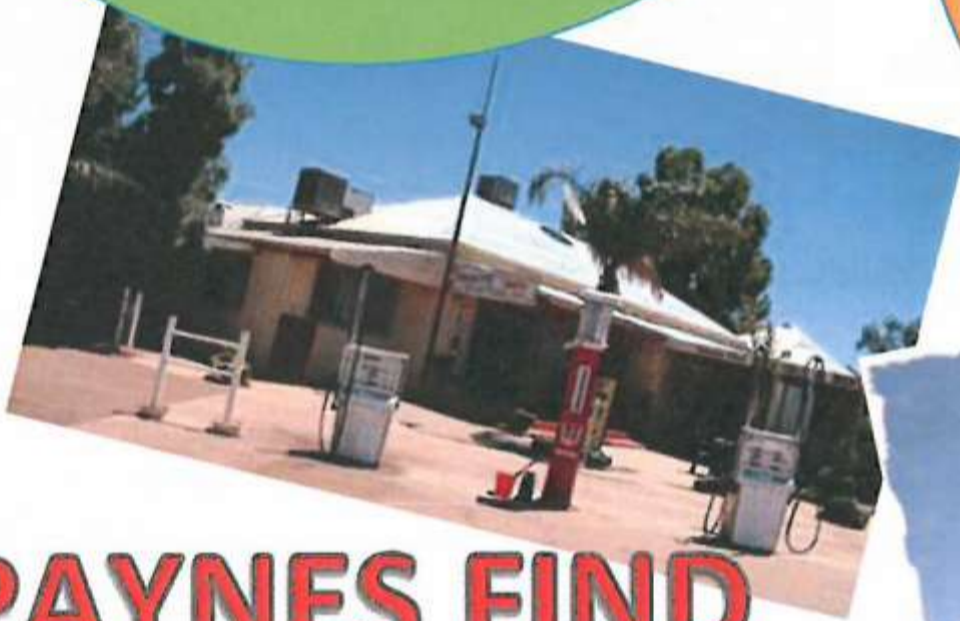
